

# Freight at Melbourne Airport

The majority of air freight is carried on passenger aircraft, enabled by Melbourne Airport's extensive airline network.

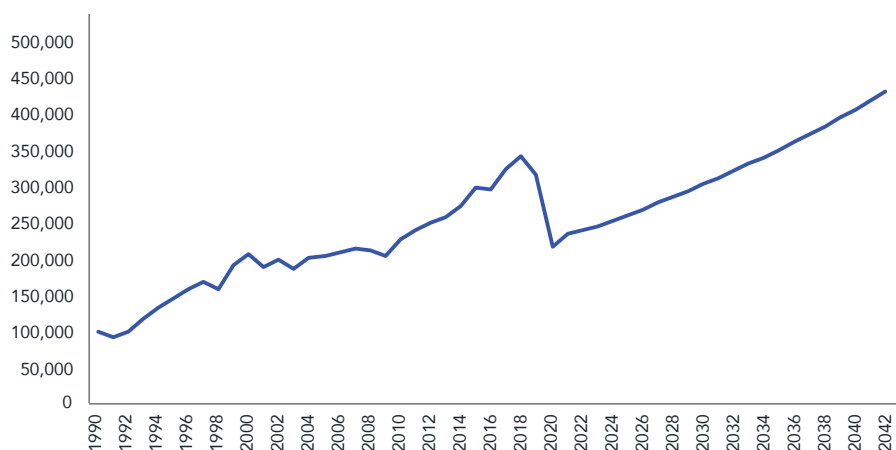
Melbourne Airport's 24-hour operation and the frequency of international services means extensive and timely opportunities for exporters in southeast Australia to access more international markets. Being close to major industrial areas also means employment opportunities for thousands of residents in nearby suburban growth corridors.

Melbourne Airport leads the nation for Australian exports, with more than 37% of the country's air freight exports passing through the airport. According to the Federal Government's 2022 Population Statement, Melbourne will become Australia's largest city in 2031-32 with just over six million people, resulting in increased freight demand.

Around 85% of all international air freight travels in the cargo hold of passenger aircraft. Meeting demand for air travel and freight to and from Melbourne is vital to the Victorian and Australian economies, and the rise of the digital economy and online shopping is fuelling demand for faster deliveries.

Melbourne Airport's third runway will increase the airport's ability to meet passenger and freight demand, presenting an opportunity to grow Victoria's economy.
